SIGMUND FREUD MUSEUM VIENNA

Berggasse 19: A Historic Site and a Renowned Private Museum

Sigmund Freud and his era have a central position in European culture and history. The Sigmund Freud Museum is dedicated to preserving, presenting and informing about this cultural heritage. Berggasse 19, in Vienna's 9th district, is among the world's best-known addresses. Between 1891 and 1938, Sigmund Freud lived and worked in this typical late-19th-century Viennese apartment house. Today these rooms house the Sigmund Freud Museum, which is an object of widespread international attention and draws more than 66,000 visitors from around the world every year.

Attractions for Travelers Interested in Culture: Exhibition & Art

In Freud's former office and private apartment, the Sigmund Freud Museum houses a permanent exhibition documenting the life and work of the founder of psychoanalysis. Unique film material showing the Freud family in the 1930s is to be seen in the video room. Furthermore, the Sigmund Freud Museum presents a Collection of Contemporary Art as well as temporary special exhibitions. A series of installations by international artists is on view day and night in the storefront of Berggasse 19.

The Sigmund Freud Museum is open 365 days a year from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., from July through September daily from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.
